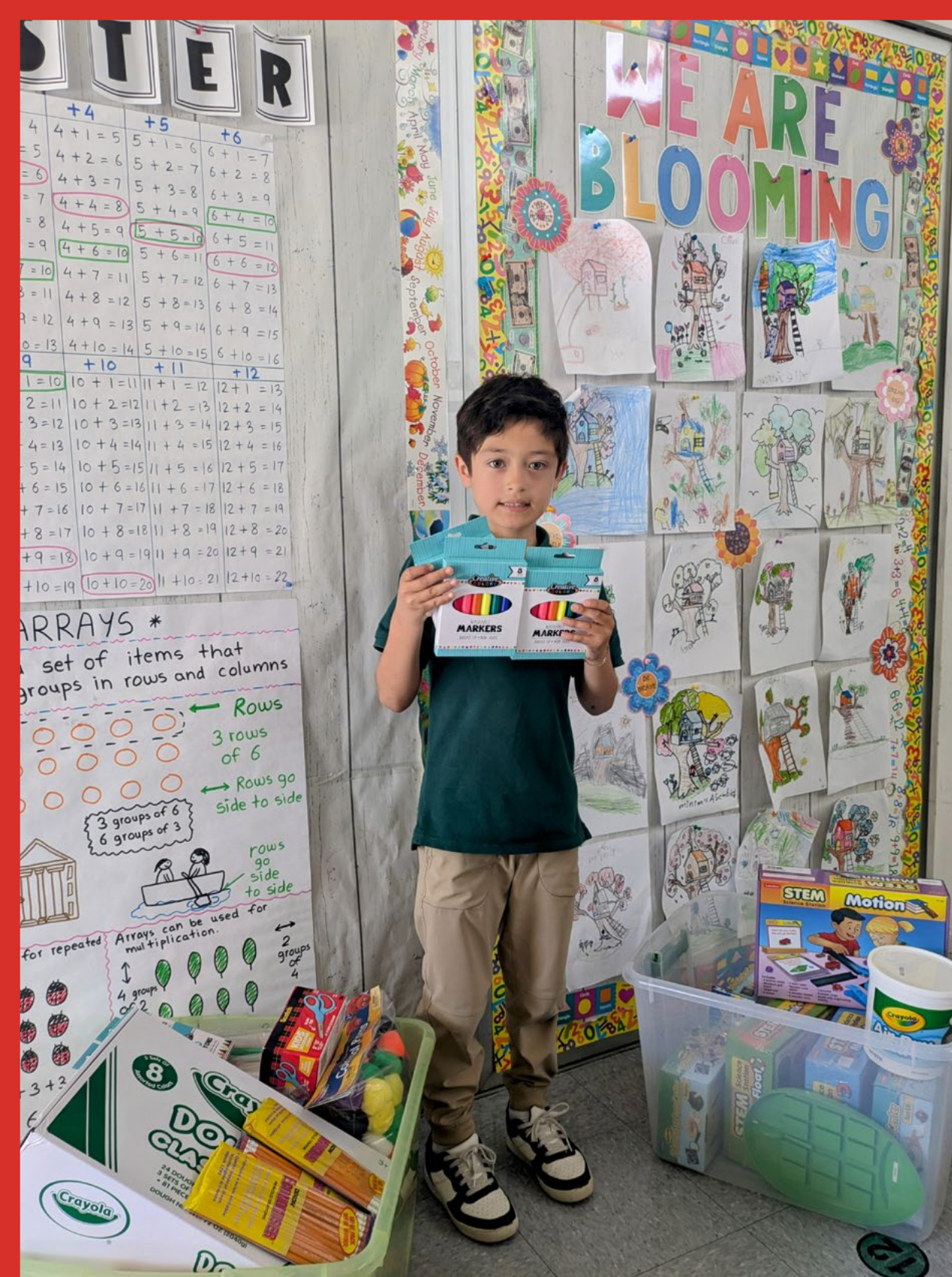

We're Still Here for Teachers

Letter From the Chief Executive Officer



To Our Community,

As I begin my tenure as CEO at AdoptAClassroom.org, I'm struck by both the enormous challenges facing our nation's teachers and the incredible resilience of those educators to keep showing up for their students. While there have been significant shifts in the PreK-12 education landscape in the U.S. since I joined AdoptAClassroom.org in 2013, one constant has been teachers spending their own money on classroom supplies. As long as that's the case, our team will continue working to secure funding so that those teachers can get exactly what their students need.

This past year, we've seen educators doing their best to provide for their students and classroom families during challenging times. Whether it's threats to school safety, funding cuts and funding delays for critical school programs, or the ongoing teacher shortage facing many of our largest school districts,

teachers are expected to do more with less. A 2025 report from the National Education Association concluded that when adjusted for inflation, on average, teachers are making 5% less than they did 10 years ago.

Against that backdrop, the fact that teachers spend an average of \$895 a year on supplies for their classrooms is even more astounding (that's 49% more than they were spending 10 years ago; even adjusting for inflation, that's a 10% increase over 2015). It makes our work at AdoptAClassroom.org more critical than ever.

It's not surprising that we've seen more teachers crowdfunding on our site this past year than in any prior year. It's a wonder those teachers even have time to seek out support given the immense professional demands they face. But, as educators tell us all the time, they do it because they care about providing the best possible learning environment for their students.

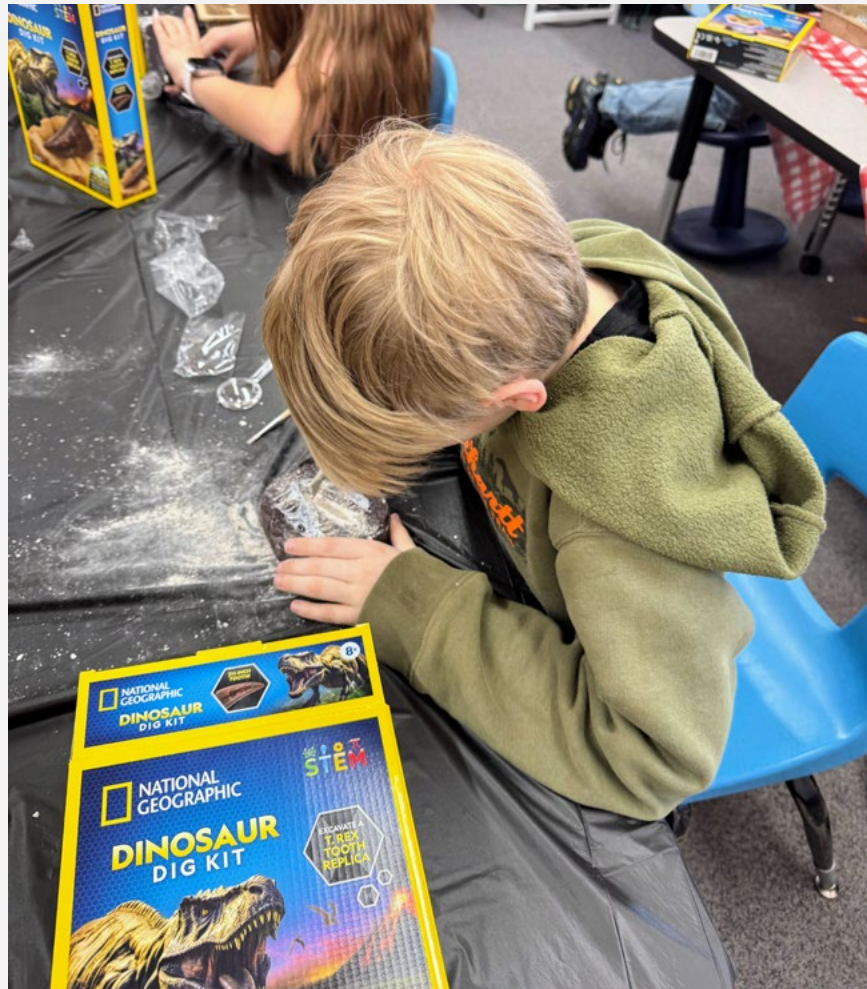

for her students. She's used AdoptAClassroom.org to create a better learning environment for her students, and she values the flexibility she has to get exactly what her students need.

While I'm grateful to our funders and our staff for raising more money for teachers this past year than ever before, there are still teachers waiting for their first donation so that they can get the essential classroom supplies their students need.

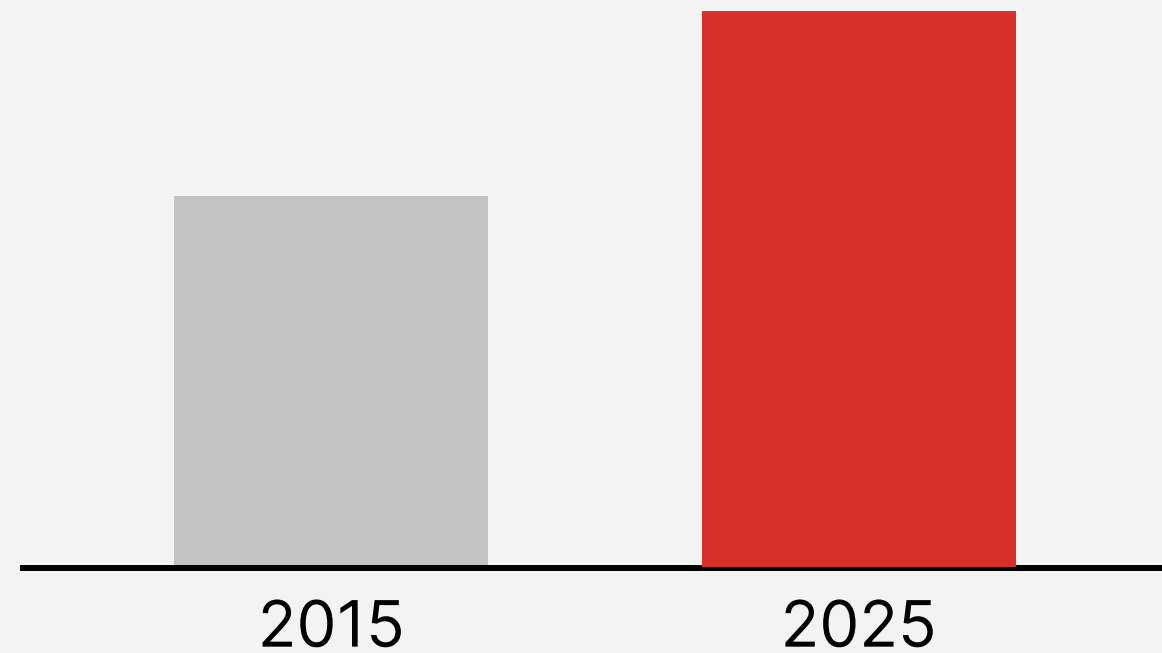

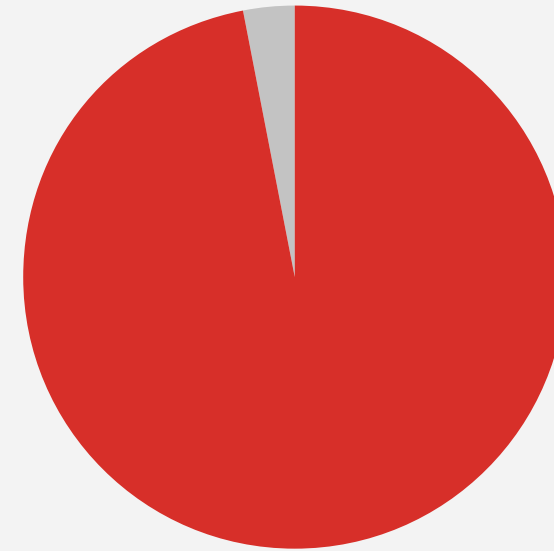
2025 Teacher Spending Survey

The median school supply budget is \$200.

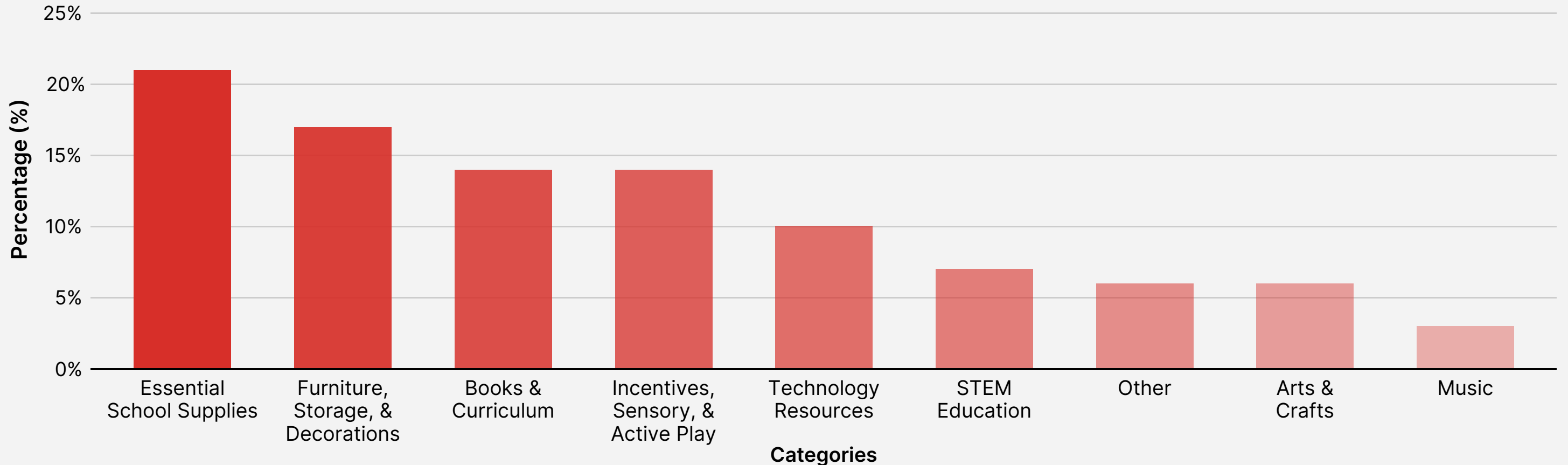


97% of teachers said their budget was not enough to cover their needs.

Q&A with a teacher supported by donors

We interviewed Francy, a third grade teacher, to see how the donations she received on AdoptAClassroom.org helped her and her students. She highlights why our donors are important to classrooms like hers.

How much of your own money do you spend on supplies for your students each year?

What is the difference AdoptAClassroom.org donations made in your classroom?

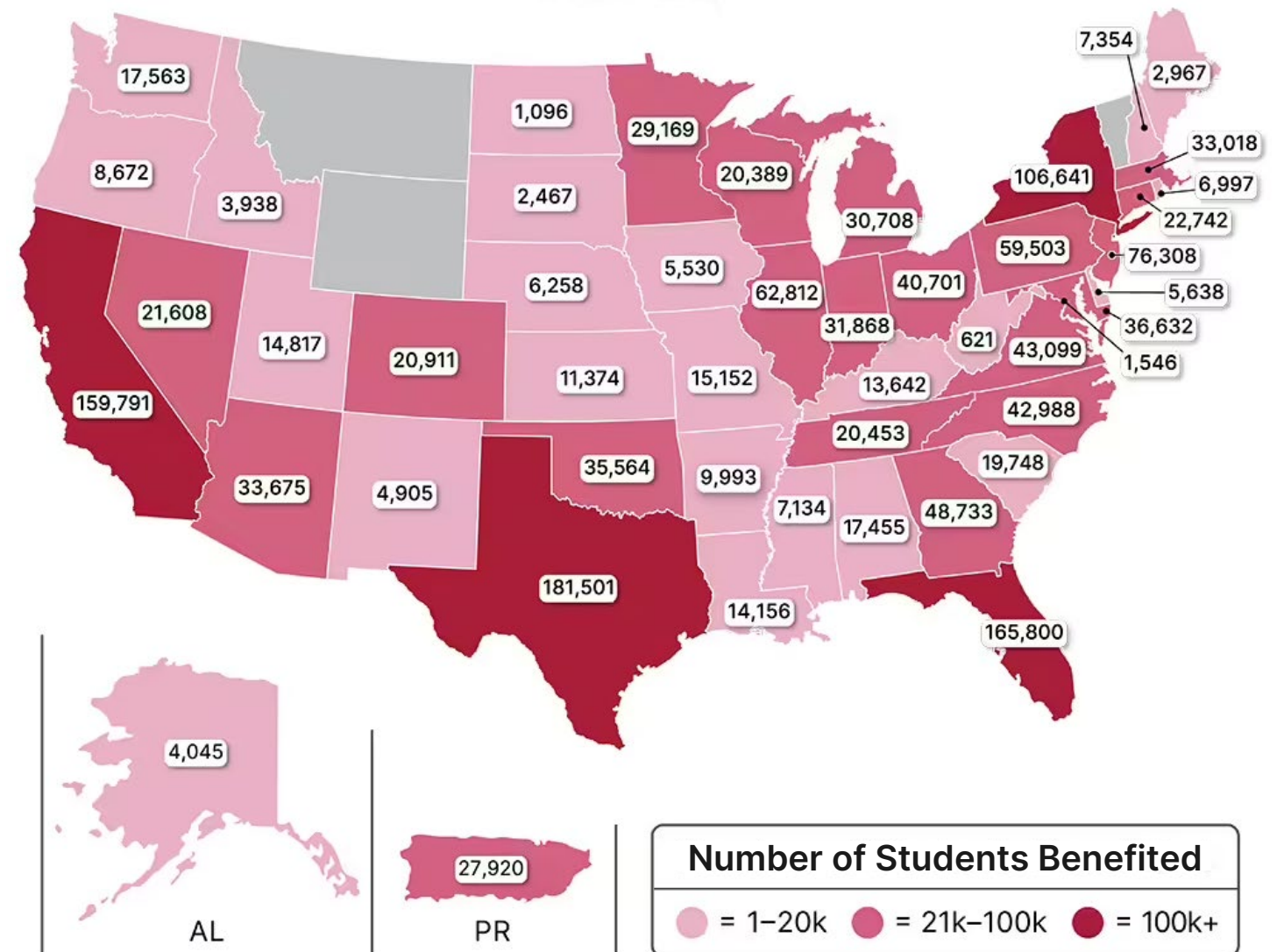


Burlington Partnership Highlight

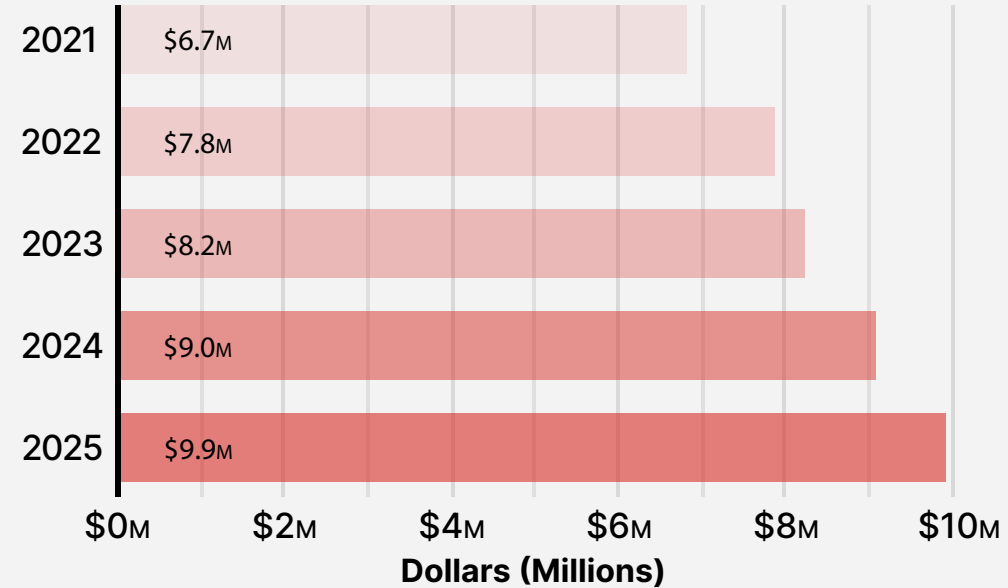

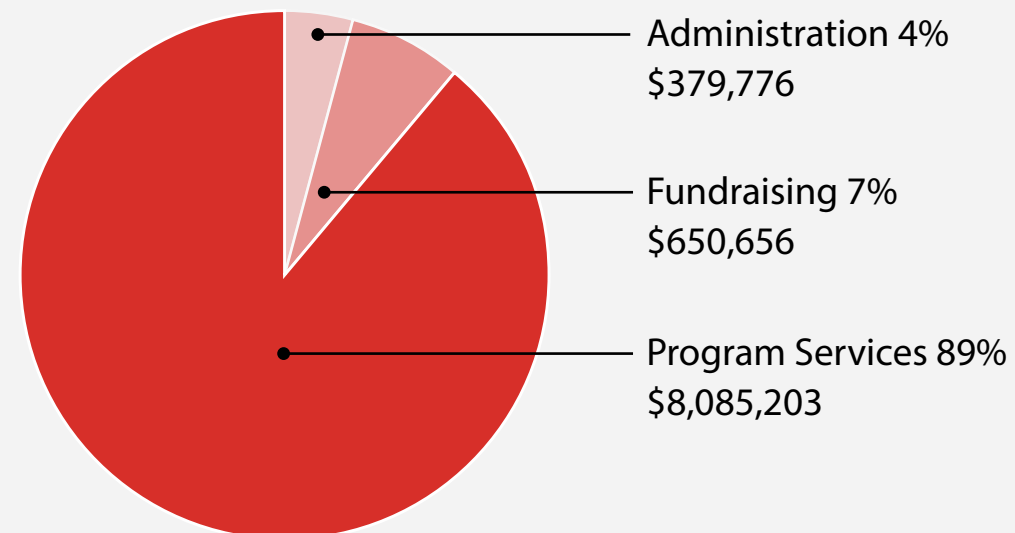
Revenue Growth Over Time
